Following my case study last semester, I will further explore my topic through primary research, completing a project to go alongside the research. My case study title was 'How do representations differ in 'classic' video games compared to modern video games when comparing an original to a remake?' and I researched social norms in relation to representations of aspects such as race and gender in video games.

I deduced that, due to primarily being played by and created by white men, some older video games have problematic, harmful representations of other demographics, such as racist stereotypes and sexist depictions of women.

This project would explore player's opinions of representations within video games, asking them if any games they've played they feel included problematic or harmful representations (not just of race and gender, of many aspects such as sexuality, religion, political standing etc.).

Through the survey findings, I would identify the game which most participants deemed as problematic. Aligning with the original case study, I would focus on the problematic aspects of representation identified in the survey results and create concept art and a game pitch/ overview explaining how these elements would be altered in a hypothetical remake for modern audiences.

My survey participants will be anonymous. To maintain anonymity, I have specified in the settings of my survey that their emails will not be collects. I have also made the questions relating to personal elements, such as age and gender identity, optional to avoid any discomfort for the participant. I will store the data in the google forms results and screenshot elements and results to use in my project evaluation. The results will be kept safe behind my password protected computer and no one else will have access to the results. After graduation, I will delete the responses to ensure the data has been destroyed.

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Representation on Video game remasters and remakes.

A video game **remaster** is a rerelease of an original game that has been enhanced by improving assets such as models, sound effects, lighting, and other aspects.

Remasters are essentially the same core game with enhanced assets and visuals to update the experience for modern players (Main Leaf, 2023).

A video game **remake** completely rebuilds the game, starting development from scratch.

Hayton (2020) explains that a remake and its original game are 'essentially different games, even if they use the same story, setting, music art or gameplay ideas'.
